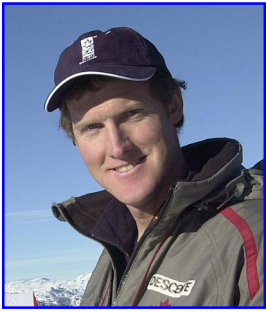

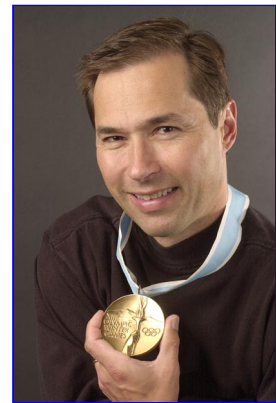

Whistler Mountain Ski Club



The Whistler Mountain Ski Club provides world-class racing and training opportunities for young ski racers from age 11 in all Alpine disciplines. A large selection of athletes on the Provincial and National Teams attests to the premier level of the Club's ski racing programs. The Club is a not-for-profit organization run by parents and associates who have extensive experience in organizing National and International events. The Club founded and runs The Whistler Cup, which has evolved into a world-class juvenile event. Last year, this event attracted over 300 racers from 20 countries, promising some of the best competition in the world for young alpine ski racers. We have a talented and enthusiastic group of 20 coaches and the positive results in competition over the last few years has rated our program as one of the best in Canada.



Whistler Secondary's "Sports School"

The Sports School at Whistler Secondary exists for students who are committed to ski racing through the Whistler Mountain Ski Club. Students who want to attend the Sports School must prove they have the commitment and determination to train at a competitive level of ski racing, which requires absence from regular classes for two full days of training in Whistler each week, and for extended absences for training and competing away. One teacher/counsellor acts as a liaison between Sports School students, teachers, coaches, and parents/guardians. This teacher meets regularly with students/coaches/parents to review progress and modify timetables on an individual basis. Students are also expected to take responsibility for self-directed study periods at home and away, and to participate in study sessions scheduled by coaches while away. When at home, students are grouped in the same homeroom class and, as much as possible, are placed together in academic classes. Because Whistler Secondary is a public school, attendance is free for Canadian students registered full time at the school.

Consistently ranked as North America's top ski and snowboard resort, Whistler Blackcomb is located a scenic two-hour drive north of Vancouver up the spectacular 'Sea to Sky' Highway.
